What type of pet are you proposing? How many?

Would this animal be kept inside?

Would this animal be kept outside? How will it be contained?

What is the adult size/weight of the animal(s)?

Who will be the primary caregiver?

How many hours of the day will the animal(s) be alone?

What is your plan for when they are alone (kennel, terrarium, cage, etc)?

How will the food be stored to prevent luring rodents/pests?

How do you plan to address animal waste and other issues the animal(s) create?

What is your plan if the animal(s) become(s) destructive or aggressive?

If the animal(s) will be kept indoors for any amount of time, are you prepared to have all carpeting professionally cleaned? How often will you have this done?

Claws can be sharp after trimming if you don't use a grinder. Will you be taking steps to ensure that sharp claws cannot scratch wood floors/linoleum/etc?

If your request is approved, are you prepared for periodic walkthroughs to check for pet damage?

After this form is submitted, you will receive a written response from the property manager regarding your request. Supplemental information may be necessary before a final decision is reached. Phone conversations may take place, but approval is not official until it is put in writing.
